



Environmental education measures

UCP is working to mitigate climate change through industrial-academia partnership. Department of Chemistry is working with Pak Green Enviro Engineering to recognize the mutual scientific and technical cooperation. To practically implement the SDG 6 in terms of access to clean water and sanitation for all, SDG 7 to have access to affordable and clean energy, SDG 13 of climate action, and SDG 9 of industry, innovation, and infrastructure, a formal MoU was signed with Pak Green Enviro Engineering Limited. It also covers primarily SDG 17. As an initial step, a project has been proposed to remove greenhouse gases and waste water treatment of local Hadyara Drain. This collaborative work includes students and research faculty of the University of Central Punjab.



Working with government

UCP has initiated several MoUs with government organizations and stakeholders to practically contribute to local managerial bodies. One of these is to provide consultancy and advice to Allama Iqbal Medical College & Jinnah Hospital. As an integral part of the committees, specific policy guidance and consultancies are provided. This step is to achieve SDG 3 of Health and Wellbeing, SDG 17 of Partnerships and 4 of Quality Education. Through this MoU, students will be able to

conduct surveys, internships, case studies, and research activities at Jinnah Hospital. This activity allowed to suggest necessary steps in providing better medication to patients and to understand the burden of a specific disease to launch future research project with the involvement of national health ministry.



Faculty of Science and Technology delivered its first official report of GMO testing in cotton to TTI Testing Laboratories on 01-12-2021 which is still active. A delegation of technical experts led by Mr. Hamed K. Lateef (CEO) & Mr. Sarim Mehmood (GM Strategy and Business Operations)



from Textile Testing Labs (TTI), Lahore visited University of Central Punjab on 01-12-2021 to receive the first official GMO report on cotton & to know more about UCP's capability in GMOs

and DNA testing for broad range of food products for sharing with their German strategic partner working on DNA based traceability systems in different food products.

TTi labs showed its utmost satisfaction with the outcome and Mr. Hamed praised this as the first step for enhancing the cotton exports from Pakistan. He lauded the efforts of UCP and expressed that this initiative marks the practical beginning of the scientific collaboration between UCP's Faculty of Life Sciences and the TTi Labs for strengthening university-industry linkages and translating the vision of the strategic leadership of UCP into reality.

National hunger

Zero hunger and food safety are the priority areas of FoST. To take practical measures for zero hunger, Department of Food Science and Technology signed MoU with Elite Nutrify to raise the awareness about healthy eating, to conduct trainings and workshops on nutrition events, and to alleviate the poor food choices among youngsters and children. The department also actively participated in the provincial seminar on food safety with government stakeholders. The ideas to ensure national food safety and to make protein-rich food accessible to all, shared by the students of food sciences department made them won several awards at Pakistan Poultry Expo.
